Getting Ready for the Autumn So What Are woodsure Logs?

Any of our customers that have purchased logs from us will probably have noticed that they are certified as being 'Woodsure' - Ready To Burn. But what does it actually mean and why is it important?

Wet wood creates smoke and particulates that are harmful to your health and the environment. It will also damage your stove and chimney and is an inefficient way to heat your home.

Woodsure is a non-profit organisation that is helping to raise the quality of woodfuel in the industry and has been appointed by Defra to run the 'Ready to Burn' certification scheme underpinning The Air Quality (Domestic Solid Fuels Standards) (England) Regulations 2020 that came into force in England from 1 May this year.

The point of the new regulations is to try and prevent harmful pollution from the domestic burning of all solid fuels by ensuring wood is certified as having a moisture content of 20% or less. This means wood or biomass can now be used as a sustainable fuel and is considered to be 'carbon lean' when it has been managed and effectively dried/seasoned.

Our logs at Meadow Grange are cut from a sustainably managed woodland close to the Garden Centre - this means that new tree growth in the woodland will be absorbing atmospheric carbon dioxide, offsetting that which is released by the wood fuel we produce - the overall contribution to atmospheric CO2 levels is minimal.

In our autumn newsletter we'll do a little case study on how we cut and manage our woodland and the process for drying our logs to ensure that it meets the Woodsure standard.

The Fabulous Yarrow Hotel in Broadstairs

Some of you may have seen on our social media pages some of the commercial work that we do for a variety of clients. We thought we'd showcase a couple here. First up is the beautiful Yarrow Hotel in Broadstairs - a stunning Jacobethan-style building that was built in 1894 by Sir Alfred Yarrow.

Originally the property was designed and constructed by the ship building magnate as a place for children to recuperate from illness. The building also played its part during the two World Wars, with soldiers able to convalesce there throughout both wars. The Yarrow building remained a children's convalescent home until the 1960s, when Thanet College took over the site to form its campus.

The Grade II Listed building was turned into a hotel after a massive refurbishment completed in July 2016. Now set within the grounds of the East Kent College Broadstairs Campus, it has training at the heart of its commercial activities. With 23 bedrooms and five suites, The Yarrow offers a luxurious stay and also has space for parties of up to 120 guests.

Our team at Meadow Grange has supplied and planted a wide range of plants in their beautiful garden and around the site for a number of years so if you're staying there or dining in their excellent restaurant and bar, do take a few moments to wander around the garden and admire our handiwork.
